YOUTH & ADULT CARDBOARD BOAT RACES!

WHY RACE CARDBOARD BOATS?

The races are held at Six Flags Hurricane Harbor for people of all ages who want to have fun by building and racing boats made entirely of cardboard. Boaters must be age 8 or older, and crews can be from 1 to 10 members. Building a boat tests a crew's technical and creative skills and fosters team spirit! Winning boats are awarded trophies for a variety of categories including the Legacy Award, Rah! Rah! Award, Fastest Finish and Judges Award. Of course sinking ships can also win a trophy: The Titanic Award!

BOAT CLASSES

CLASS I BOATS

These boats are propelled by canoe/kayak oars, or paddles. These propulsion tools, as well as decorations, may be constructed from materials other than cardboard. **All other parts of the boat must be corrugated cardboard.** Nuts, bolts, washers and staples are not allowed.

CLASS II BOATS

Class II boats must meet the requirements of Class I boats, with the exception of the propulsion and steering systems, as follows. The muscle-powered propulsion system (propellers, paddle wheels, sails) and the steering system (rudders) need not be made of cardboard, but the materials used must not contribute significantly to the structural rigidity of the boat. Propulsion and steering systems must be designed and fabricated by the entrant. In addition, the connections between the propulsion and steering systems must be made of corrugated cardboard. Propulsion and steering devices must not damage the bottom of the Wave Pool. Oars, paddles and cardboard surfboards are prohibited in this class, as is swimming.

BUILD-ON-SITE BOATS

Boats in this class will be built on-site at Hurricane Harbor event day. Basic boat building supplies will be provided (3 pieces of double ply cardboard, 2 rolls of duct tape, 2 sheets of plastic, box cutter, a pencil and yard stick). Participants have 2 hours to build their guppy boat with the supplies provided to them. Build-on-Site boats will race in the wave pool and use oars or paddles to propel themselves.

Build-on-Site registration fee is \$50.
